

Level Three Assessment (Voice)

To complete this level, students must demonstrate fluency in the following areas:

Technique

Must demonstrate:

- Technique taught at previous levels with increasing control
- Ability to move the voice a bit faster and hold phrases a bit longer
- Ability sing in a Foreign Language

Must be able to sing a variety of voice exercises:

- 1 octave scales on any vowel (keeping consistent tone)
- Solfege Patterns: Diatonic 3rds in Major
- Octave Major Arpeggios legato on Ma or staccato on ee or ah.
- Vaccai Lesson 3 on a single consonant vowel combination such as "Loo", "La" or "No", or the student may sing the English or Italian lyrics written in the music if they prefer.

Sight Singing

Rhythmic Reading: The student must be able to sight read two 8-bar rhythmic examples. One will be in either 3/4 or 4/4 and the other will be in 6/8, 9/8 or 12/8. Student should strive to maintain a steady beat throughout. The tempo will be indicated in the music. The student will have 30 seconds to mentally practice before performing. Note values may include anything introduced at any previous level. Examples will likely include dynamics.

Melodic Reading: The student must perform two contrasting 4-bar melodic examples (student chooses tempo). The student will have 30 seconds to mentally practice before performing. Examples will follow the following parameters:

- On treble clef staff or bass clef (be prepared) using a one octave range.
- All examples could be in any of the following Major keys: C, G, D, A or F or it could be in the key of A or C minor
- Examples may include stepwise motion, repeated notes and skips of a 3rd or to the root note on the top or bottom of the octave. There may be unexpected changes in direction.
- Any rhythmic values introduced this far may be used.

Ear Training

The Student must be able to identify the following by ear:

- A melodic example from a choice of 3
- A rhythmic examples from a choice of 3
- Intervals: m2, M2, m3, M3, P4, P5 and P8 (played melodically and harmonically)

 Chord (triads) Qualities: Major, minor, Augmented diminished

Students will have the opportunity to hear each example 2 times.

Performance

The student must perform 3 contrasting songs. Memorization is required for all. Here is the criteria: theater piece that encourages mastery of basic techniques. Each song must include the following:

- 1 piece must be in a foreign language
- 1 must be a classical piece from the Baroque, Classic or Romantic Period
- 1 must be a classical piece from the Baroque, Classic or Romantic Period OR a high level jazz or musical theatre piece.
- 1 can be a piece of any genre (student choice)
- Songs must each be at least 2 minutes
- Songs must be at an intermediate technique level showcasing the singer's progress and ability to handle repertoire with greater demands.

Improvisation: Student must improvise on a 12-Bar Blues. Student must be able to hear where the root note is after hearing a 12-bar progression once through the form. Harmonization:

- 1. Student must sing the melody of Happy Birthday while the teacher harmonizes.
- 2. The student must sing any harmony part to Happy Birthday while the teacher sings the melody. The student may choose the key.

Music Theory

 * Suggested Text: Basics of Keyboard Theory Level 2 by Julie McIntosh Johnson

The student must be able to identify and define the following:

- Note Identification: Must be able to recite the following notes in under 60 seconds:
 - Treble clef: ALL notes on staff including 1st ledger line below (C) and the 1st ledger line above (A) the staff.
 - Bass clef: ALL notes on staff including 1st ledger line below (E) and 1st ledger line above (C) the staff.
- Time signatures: All from previous level plus common time, cut time and 2/2.
- Dynamic markings: All dynamic markings found in Basics of keyboard theory books through Level 2
- Intervals: The student must be able to identify unisons, octaves and specific 2nds, 3rds 4ths and 5ths.

• The student must be able to identify all of the above in a 4-8 measure musical excerpt plus any terms or items introduced at a previous level or in Basics of Keyboard Theory books Prep- Level 2.

Signs, Symbols and Terms

All from previous levels plus:

- Articulations: accent, tenuto, staccato, slur
- Common Voice Types: Soprano, Mezzo Soprano, Tenor, Baritone, Bass
- All Navigation: ending numbers, fine, D.C., D.S, and Coda
- Tempo alterations: All from previous levels plus accelerando
- Tempos: largo, lento, andante, moderato, andante, allegro, vivace, presto
